## "How shall we picture the kingdom of God?" ... It is like a mustard seed ... " Mark 4:30-32

The Mustard Seed Foundation is a Christian family foundation established in 1983 under the leadership of Dennis W. Bakke and Eileen Harvey Bakke. The Foundation was created as an expression of their desire to be faithful stewards of the financial resources entrusted to them, to bring together the Christian members of their extended families into common ministry, and to advance the Kingdom of God. The Foundation provides grants to churches and Christian organizations worldwide that are engaged in Christian ministries including outreach, discipleship, and economic empowerment. The Foundation also awards scholarships to Christians pursuing advanced educational degrees in preparation for leadership roles in both the Church and society. All directors and staff of the Mustard Seed Foundation are committed followers of Jesus Christ. The Foundation affirms the Lausanne Covenant as its missional commitment to the world.

### Dear Friends of the Mustard Seed Foundation,

This year Mustard Seed Foundation is 25 years old. We remember and celebrate those special years of God's faithfulness in leading the Foundation.

In 1982 we had been married just over a year. Dennis had recently co-founded AES, a fledgling electricity generation company. While driving to West Virginia for a weekend getaway, God spoke to our hearts. He gave us the idea that someday (presumably when and if we had some extra funds), we could steward our financial resources through a family foundation that would give money to Christ-centered organizations, churches, and individuals engaged in ministry. This dream constituted a big part of our conversation during the weekend, but no definitive plans were made, or strategy designed.

In November we traveled to Chicago to celebrate Thanksgiving with several members of the Bakke family. On an early morning walk to the local coffee shop with his father Tollef and brother Ray, Dennis shared the vision God had given earlier that fall to form a family foundation at some point in the future.

Ray suggested we start a foundation immediately, even if it was done with only a few thousand dollars. The brainstorming continued during Thanksgiving dinner and the outline of a foundation was born. It was an amazing Thanksgiving, but we still had little idea how God would shape this new organization and provide funding to fulfill our dreams and plans.

We incorporated the Foundation in 1983. In 1984 we gave five grants totaling \$11,600, an average of less than \$3,000 per grant. We chose the Foundation's name from Jesus' parable about how God can do mighty things with a mustard seed of faith; we prayed that God would bless and multiply our few small grants. Even today, our grants to churches around the world average just over

\$5,000—mustard seeds. During those early years, the grants were developed by family Board members and sent to Eileen for processing, often among diapers and babies on the floor or the foot of our bed.

We were blessed when Craig Nauta, another family member, became the first staff member and director of the Foundation in 1990. For 13 years he recruited and led a small band of dedicated and talented staffers as we shaped the Foundation's giving strategies and expanded the global reach of our granting. In 2001 we added our first international staff member in Mumbai, India. Today we have 11 staff serving in seven countries. The Foundation is fortunate to have seasoned, professional staff members who have served for many years. Our current Executive Directors, Eric Hornberger and Lonni Jackson, have served on the Foundation staff for ten years each. Other family members, Scott Bakke and Brian Bakke, have been members of the staff for nearly a decade.

Since early in our history, the core of Mustard Seed's giving has been small grants to churches, mostly in the developing world, to support their discipleship, outreach, church planting, and empowerment programs. We have found that giving small startup grants to churches, matching the funding they provide for ministry projects, empowers the mission of churches and roots accountability for the project's success in that community. In the past quarter century, we have given 5,622 grants to churches and other organizations in 144 nations. Today church-based granting continues to represent about 50% of our annual operating budget.

In 1992 we started the Harvey Fellows program to assist talented graduate students headed for careers, such as university teaching positions, and other callings

usually identified as secular. Over the past 15 years the Foundation has given \$8,873,139 in support of 284 gifted Christian scholars and leaders from the U.S. and 27 other countries. The Harvey Fellows alumni continue to be actively engaged with the current Fellows, leading the Advisory Board that oversees selecting Fellows each year, publicizing the program, and planning gatherings to teach and encourage one another.

In 1999 we began our Theological Education (TE) program, working with seminaries and Bible colleges outside the U.S. to provide scholarship funds to students who are preparing to serve as pastors or seminary professors after graduation. In the past nine years, Mustard Seed has granted \$8,189,175 in TE scholarships to 75 schools in 46 countries.

In recent years we have added a program to provide scholarship funds for Bakke Graduate University (BGU), an international seminary and graduate school founded by Ray Bakke. In 2007 we introduced an exciting program to fund Theology of Work courses at seminaries and other schools worldwide. Lowell Bakke, through his position at BGU, leads this program for the Foundation.

Mustard Seed Foundation is led by a Board comprised of members of three generations of the Harvey and Bakke families. A professor of philanthropy at Duke University once told us that to his knowledge, Mustard Seed is the only foundation in the country that involves members from two extended families. We are extremely grateful for the Board's prayerful, wise oversight of the Foundation. Twenty-four family members have served on the Board either as permanent or five-year rotating members. In 1997 we formed a Junior Board of family members aged 13-18 in order to expose our teens to missions and teach stewardship. Twenty-three of our teens have reviewed grants, made giving decisions, and taken mission trips to visit our grant projects. Two former Junior Board members now serve on the "senior" Board.

We want to take this opportunity to recognize Paul Pearson for serving on the Board and as the Treasurer for 24 years. Paul gave countless hours of his time to establish and guide the Foundation, and we will always be indebted to him for his many contributions. We also want to thank Lowell Bakke, who rotated off the Board after five years of service. The Board wants to express our appreciation to staff members Jacob Baby, Hilton Figueriedo, Duane Grobman, Art Medina, Eric Musee, and Maged Shafik, who departed from the staff this year. Their work on behalf of the Foundation and for Christ's Kingdom will no doubt have a lasting worldwide impact.

Through the years, MSF has weathered many challenges that serve to remind us that God is sovereign and that this ministry belongs to him. In 2001 a decline in the price of AES stock used to fund Mustard Seed caused the Foundation to temporarily suspend giving. Again in 2009, we face difficult economic times that will affect the amount of funds available for grants and scholarships. Nonetheless, we plan to forge ahead, giving away what has been entrusted to us as long as the Lord calls us to this work.

We are humbled by the opportunity God has given the Bakke and Harvey families to steward his resources by giving \$72 million in grants and scholarships to individuals and institutions working to glorify our Lord around the globe. We stand in awe of our Lord and his sustaining hand on the Mustard Seed Foundation for the past 25 years. To God be all the glory!



# GIVING AREAS

#### GRANTS

As our name implies, the Mustard Seed Foundation provides seed funding for small startup projects of churches and Christian organizations around the world. We seek to partner with local congregations that identify, equip, and support their members who are called to specific areas of ministry in the Church and society. We look for initiatives that offer innovative approaches to local church-based ministries. Mustard Seed seeks to help launch projects as a minority partner, providing funds over a limited time period, and in a way that encourages self-sufficiency and reliance on the local church. We consider local church accountability and financial support primary indicators of the priority, integrity, and sustainability of a particular project. A church must be willing to invest financially in a project for Mustard Seed to consider funding that project. The Foundation has a strong interest in the unique challenges faced by urban churches. As the world rapidly urbanizes, we believe that investing in churches located in large cities to be particularly strategic. We typically fund projects that share the gospel with non-Christians (outreach), generate income and economic decision-making opportunities to poorer Christians (empowerment), or equip Christians to better proclaim and demonstrate the gospel (discipleship).

### **SCHOLARSHIPS**

The Mustard Seed Foundation offers a variety of scholarship opportunities for Christians seeking advanced degrees in the United States and around the world. We believe that providing scholarships to individuals, who are furthering their formal education to become better ministers within the local church and society, helps enable the Church to reach the whole world with the whole gospel. Mustard Seed believes that our scholarships empower individuals to take ownership for equipping themselves for Christian service. Scholarships also encourage educational institutions to remain student-focused and accountable to deliver the highest quality of education at an affordable cost. Through our scholarship initiatives, the Mustard Seed Foundation hopes to equip believers for strategic roles within the full spectrum of Christian ministry, from place of business to place of worship. In 2008 the Foundation awarded scholarships through three programs: Harvey Fellows, Theological Education scholarships, and Bakke Gradate University scholarships.

### OTHER GIVING

Over the past twenty-five years, the Foundation has initiated and funded programs that are outside of our traditional giving areas of church-based grants and scholarships. This other giving typically goes towards new or special initiatives of the Foundation. In 2008 this included Theology of Work grants, and matching personal gifts given by Foundation Board and staff members to Christian organizations.

# GUIDING PRINCIPLES

To celebrate the twenty-five year history of the Mustard Seed Foundation, five Board members have reflected on our guiding principles. These principles encompass the fundamental values of the organization and are underlying in the priorities for our giving.

# Christ and His Kingdom

The gospel of Jesus Christ and the advancement of his Kingdom are central to all that we are and all that we do. It is our joy to worship and serve him and to submit ourselves to the authority of the Bible. We seek to be Christ's servants and ambassadors and to encourage as many as will come to follow Christ. We seek to encourage the formation of disciples from every "unreached" community, city, and culture. We desire to see the whole Church bring the whole gospel to the whole world. Therefore, we award grants and scholarships to churches and individuals representing the spectrum of biblical Christianity, including Orthodox, Catholic, Protestant, and Evangelical traditions. We affirm God's redeeming and restorative grace and power as sufficient to bring blessing to all structures, institutions, and societies. All grant and scholarship recipients of the Mustard Seed Foundation must proclaim a personal faith in Christ, affirm the basic tenets of orthodox Christianity, and desire to serve and witness in Christ's name.

Christ and his Kingdom is the *foundation* for the Mustard Seed Foundation. Even before Dennis and Eileen met and married, their lives were committed to Christ and this was reason for the initial thought, dream and vision for the Mustard Seed Foundation. They wanted to participate in the furthering of the Kingdom of God.

I wish I had saved the notes, especially those scribbled on napkins, yellow pads, and in margins, that chronicle the formation, reaffirmation, and continual wrestling through the guiding principles over the twenty-five years of the birth and growth of this mustard seed. Many things have changed in the Foundation, but there was never a question that Christ and his Kingdom was primary. However, we have worked on how to express this clearly.

At the 2004 annual meeting, the Board and staff reviewed and reaffirmed our vision—it was appropriately named Vision 2004ward. Some additions were made to the wording of the principle of "Christ and his Kingdom:" we incorporated the phrase "we desire to see the whole Church bring the whole gospel to the whole world," borrowing from the Lausanne Covenant's section on the Church and Evangelism. And we added a sentence acknowledging the spectrum of biblical Christianity in the Church around the world.

In addition to the grant and scholarship recipients, all Board and staff members of the Foundation are held to this principle in that we must proclaim a personal faith in Christ, affirm the basic tenets of orthodox Christianity and desire to serve and witness in Christ's name. By submitting a personal statement of faith in Christ that is reaffirmed or amended each year, each of us attempts to verbalize the foundational truth of Christ and his Kingdom as a guiding principle in our own lives.

## FINANCIAL SUMMARY

In 1984 the Foundation invested \$11,600 in five small grants. Twenty-five years later, the Foundation's \$5,827,380. expenditures totaled Approximately 73 percent of these funds were given to individuals, churches, and Christian organizations through over 365 scholarships and 643 grants. The remaining 27 percent was used to administer this work through an international team of 16 staff around the globe. While the Foundation has grown in total expenditures almost every year of its history, 2008 was a year in which the Foundation had an unexpected reduction in funding due to the global economic downturn. Overall, the Foundation has given over \$72 million to further God's transformative work around the world.

The giving of five grants in 1984 launched the Foundation's primary granting program that would continue to be the cornerstone of giving up to the present time. After a few years of granting, the Foundation focused on partnering directly with local churches, requiring grants to be matched by relevant congregations. Overall, the Foundation has given over \$47 million in churchbased granting, representing about 65 percent of our total giving. In 2008 the Foundation awarded \$3,208,424 through 616 grants worldwide.



The Foundation also initiated academic scholarship programs within a decade of existence. In 1992 the Foundation started the Bakke Scholars and Harvey Fellows scholarship programs. Both scholarships sought to support academically gifted individuals attempting to integrate their Christian calling within their influential vocational pursuits. The Bakke Scholars program was for undergraduates attending specific partner institutions,

which included University of Puget Sound, Princeton, Duke, Harvard, Stanford, and Howard University. In 1998 the Foundation started a scholarship to select Christian schools within the Council for Christian Colleges & Universities (CCCU) for undergraduate minority students. In 2002, while the Foundation was amidst a season of significant financial downturn, the Board discontinued the Bakke Scholars and CCCU scholarship programs. The Harvey Fellows program continues to be a key part of Mustard Seed giving as a total of \$8,873,139 has been invested in the program. In 2008 the Foundation awarded \$664,833 to 73 Harvey Fellows.


The Mustard Seed Foundation also provides scholarships for theological studies. As the Foundation grew its international granting with local churches, the need for quality theological education in the developing world became a priority. A Theological Education (TE) scholarship program was started in 1994, and then reconstituted into the current structure in 1999. Overall, the Foundation has invested \$8,189,175 in TE scholarships through 75 schools. In 2008 Mustard Seed gave \$237,052 through 183 scholarships at nine institutions.

called the Raymond J. Bakke (RJB) Award for leaders in urban ministry studying under the mentorship of Ray Bakke. In 2006 the Foundation began providing similar scholarships through Bakke Graduate University (BGU). In 2008 the Foundation gave \$222,763 for 109 scholarships at BGU.

The Mustard Seed Foundation has a desire to use its resources to help Christians integrate their faith in all areas of their lives, including their secular work. To promote this concept, the Foundation started the Theology of Work (TOW) grant program in 2007 to provide grants to seminaries and institutions that are creatively advancing the study of workplace theology. In 2008 Mustard Seed gave 27 TOW grants to teaching institutions totaling \$208,976.



It has been priority of the Foundation to keep administrative costs low since its inception. When the Foundation started, there was no staff; the volunteer Board developed and managed all the grants, keeping administrative costs low. In order to facilitate the growing portfolio of international church-based granting and new scholarship programs, it was necessary to hire staff and spend more to administer the increasing work. In 1990 the Foundation hired its first staff, and in 2008 the Foundation had staff in eight cities around the world. The total administrative spending of the Foundation in 2008 was \$1,257,394.

The Foundation has been thankful for the opportunity to steward God's resources to Christ-centered projects and people around the world for the last twenty-five years. When starting out with five grants in 1984, no one could have imagined the Foundation would give over 5,500 more.



# Global

The Mustard Seed Foundation recognizes the global nature of the body of Christ. Therefore, we desire to participate in God's work to encourage churches and individuals through grants and scholarships around the world. Our goal is to give the majority of our funding to churches and individuals worldwide, while intentionally limiting our investment in the United States. Since the Foundation's inception in 1983, we have awarded grants and scholarships in nearly 150 countries.

> We are witnessing the greatest migration in world's history as peoples from nearly every country flock to cities on all six continents. Mission today is no longer geographically distant, across oceans, deserts, jungles or mountains, but across the streets of cities where migrant streams and diverse cultures intersect. In the past missionaries went to remote



places because that's where the majority of unreached peoples live. No longer. The Mustard Seed Foundation made city ministry partnerships the focus from our first grants. We believe it is God who is bringing the nations to the neighborhoods in our generation, to provide yet one more opportunity to hear the gospel and see kingdom values proclaimed and demonstrated in vital city ministries. This is happening most where both cities and Christians are growing fastest today – in Asia, Africa and Latin America.

The population of the U.S. is about 4.5 percent of the world. When we began the Foundation twenty-five years ago, nearly every foundation we knew of gave their money to American ministries in the United States, or to Americanled missions and ministries outside the U.S. We also recognized that about 80% of the world's active Christians and emerging ministries were outside the West.

In the providence of God, Mustard Seed had a strong global network almost the day we began. By 1983, the Lausanne Urban Networks and some wonderfully gifted leaders from many global locations had become friends and partners who could help us find and vet local grants. With their help, we began by sending the majority of our funds outside the United States. Because we would be granting in places where we didn't have firsthand knowledge as a Board, we adopted a corollary principle of matching grants. If a church or ministry could get their own local church to contribute half of the dollars they were asking from us, or match the amount we were giving, we knew the project was both real and valued. This has made it possible to give grants in about 150 of the world's 200 nations on six continents.

# HARVEY FELLOWS PROGRAM

The Foundation initiated the Harvey Fellows Program in 1992. The goal of the program is to mark, equip, and encourage followers of Jesus Christ who seek to actively integrate their faith and vocations as leaders in strategic occupations where Christians are underrepresented. This idea grew from our understanding of God as Creator and Redeemer, not only of human beings, but also of society's disciplines and structures. Our desire is to identify, prepare, and celebrate this generation's Josephs, Lydias, Daniels, and Esthers – Christians who will assume positions of leadership and influence. Each Fellow is awarded a \$16,000 annual stipend for up to three years. The award is given to students enrolled at a premier graduate degree program. Typically Harvey Fellows attend schools considered by professionals to be among the top five globally in a given subject area or specialty.

A significant component of the program is participation in a weeklong summer program that provides a forum for discussion on integrating faith and vocation. The Summer Institute is a place for Fellows to meet and build relationships with others with similar visions. The Foundation believes this occasion is vital for the marking and equipping of Fellows. The 2008 Summer Institute was held in Alexandria, Virginia.

In 2008 the Foundation invested \$664,833 in support of 73 graduate students preparing to enter strategic ministry in academia, the arts, and the marketplace. We were privileged to award 28 new fellowships to an extraordinary group of graduate students representing a variety of nationalities and preparing for vocations in diverse fields.



## THEOLOGICAL EDUCATION SCHOLARSHIPS

The Theological Education Scholarship Program was started in 1999 to support students pursuing advanced theological training outside of the United States and Canada. Scholarships are awarded for up to half of the total cost of education. Qualifying students must be attending a participating institution and receiving a significant level of financial support from their home church or Christian organization. Recipients must be pursuing degrees that equip them for service to the Church in the areas of preaching, teaching, missions, or evangelism. However, priority is given to those who are being trained to directly minister in a church congregation or preparing for ministry within an urban context. The scholarships are administered in direct collaboration with participating institutions that are interdenominational and considered strategic within their own region.

In 2008 we invested a total of \$237,052 to 183 students in nine institutions around the world. Our total support for this initiative was drastically reduced due to the global financial downturn. We intend to fund additional students in 2009 that would have typically been funded in 2008.

# BGU SCHOLARSHIPS

In 1997 we began providing a handful of scholarships to select urban ministry practitioners pursuing non-residential doctoral degrees under the mentorship of global urban missiologist and founding member of our Board of Directors, Dr. Raymond J. Bakke. In 2005 we began awarding the scholarship to students studying at the newly formed Bakke Graduate University of Ministry (BGU) based in Seattle, Washington. We broadened the scholarship to honor the life of Ray's younger siblings, Rev. Lowell Bakke, Mrs. Marilyn Bakke Pearson and Dennis Bakke who have also contributed significantly to the ministry of the Mustard Seed Foundation.

These scholarships offered through BGU focus on encouraging ministry practitioners to obtain the advanced degrees they need to deepen the theological basis of their work. Most of those supported are pursuing the Doctorate of Ministry (DMin) degree in Transformational Leadership for the Global City that is offered through BGU on a non-residential, modular basis. This program is designed to make major urban centers of the world become laboratories of learning. The Foundation also supported a handful of students pursuing a Master of Theological Studies (MTS) or a Master of Arts in Global Urban Ministry (MAGUM) degree.

In 2008 we were pleased to award scholarships through the Bakke Graduate University of Ministry for the advanced studies of 109 ministry practitioners totaling \$222,763. These talented men and women come from and serve in a variety of urban centers around the world where they are actively responding to God's calling in ministry.

# THEOLOGY OF WORK

The Theology of Work (TOW) grant program was established in 2007 by the Mustard Seed Foundation in collaboration with the Bakke Graduate University of Ministry (BGU). The aim of this special grant initiative is to encourage theological institutions worldwide to instruct seminarians, pastors, and educators in a biblical basis of a theology of work. A proper theology of work empowers ordinary people to infuse their Christian faith in the institutions, structures, and industries in which they work throughout the week. We believe there is a great need for pastors to learn how to steward the gifts of their congregants to engage in God's calling in their work as well as in all other areas of their lives.

Theology of Work grants are awarded to theological institutions, both formal and nonformal, to create and offer courses that teach students a theology of work to enable them to teach others. This grant initiative hopes to encourage seminaries and other theological training organizations to integrate such a theology in their core curriculum by promoting the development and teaching of theology of work courses. It is our desire to see those trained through our grants begin teaching and modeling this theological concept in their own churches and ministries. The TOW grants program is administered by BGU, which has created a network of people and resources specializing in developing and teaching curriculum for theology of work.

In 2008 we awarded 27 grants totaling \$202,341 to seminaries and ministries around the world. We hope these grants lead to a greater number of churches actively teaching their congregants a strong theology of work.

# Small Beginnings

The biblical parable of the mustard seed reminds us that great things often have small beginnings. Through abiding in Christ and following him our seemingly small efforts possess power beyond imagination. This parable exhorts us to respond faithfully to God's calling, but to trust outcomes to him. In our giving we seek to trust individuals and churches as they listen to God by taking small steps toward their visions. Therefore, our grants are available to churches, including those that may be poor, powerless, or unproven. We recognize that results cannot be guaranteed and that big results often have risky beginnings. We choose to specialize in small startup initiatives, trusting that what is sown in faith will return abundantly.

When the Mustard Seed Foundation began giving in 1984, the AES Corporation that I co-founded was only three years old. Its financial success was mostly wishful thinking at the time. Few people projected that the small, startup company would become a large global power company fifteen years later. I told my father Tollef and brother Ray during an early morning Thanksgiving stroll in Chicago about Eileen and my musings regarding the start of a foundation, if and when AES became successful. They responded with, "Why wait? Start small with what you have. A few little grants could make a big difference for local churches and missions."

The name of the foundation, "Mustard Seed," was chosen to capture this approach to giving. During the first year of operation, MSF made five small grants totaling almost \$12,000. Jesus was born in a small town to a humble couple from a seemingly insignificant people group. The theme of small beginnings, and humble but faithful individuals is central to all of scripture.

We recognized that most foundations gave larger grants to well-established entities. The idea behind this giving is to reduce the risk of failure. We have always believed part of our special niche would be to invest in small risky projects with no guarantee of success. Most of the grants we give are to small churches that never have received grants from any other organization.

Twenty-five years after its start, over 50 percent of the Foundation's funds are still being awarded primarily to small local churches in the developing world. The average grant size to these churches in 2008 was \$5,200. After twenty-five years, "Small Beginnings" remains the core of the Mustard Seed's approach to giving.

# Local Church

We recognize the Church as God's primary representative in the world. Therefore, we try to maximize the role and responsibility of local congregations in the initiatives we support. We seek to partner with and empower local congregations to identify, equip, and support their members who are called to specific areas of ministry in the Church, marketplace, and the world. We also consider local church support and accountability as primary indicators of the priority, integrity, and sustainability of any potential grant or scholarship initiative.

A couple of years after we started the Foundation, we noticed that most of our grant requests came from U.S. parachurch organizations. These organizations generally had effective ministries in youth work, evangelism, church planting, and conferences, as well as greater sophistication in soliciting foundation grants. However, they seemed to ignore or bypass churches as they initiated ministry efforts that the local church should be doing. The success of parachurch ministries seemed to be unintentionally weakening the effective outreach of the local church.

Dennis and I discussed with the Mustard Seed Board how to do granting that did not weaken local churches. The Board adopted the strategy of empowering churches by matching monies that churches commit to their evangelism and discipleship ministries. Not only does our policy of matching church contributions empower local churches, it keeps the accountability for the ministry rooted in the local worshipping community, rather than with a larger, more distant parachurch organization or the funding foundation.

The Mustard Seed Foundation's strategy of partnering with local churches through matching grant funds can be complex and risky, but I believe that it honors the work of the Holy Spirit in the ministry of the local church – the bride of Christ. Over the years we have found this emphasis on the local church relatively unique in Christian philanthropy and a clear distinctive of Mustard Seed from other funding organizations.

Mustard Seed has supported an amazing and diverse group of people — from pastors in villages of sub-Saharan Africa to policy-makers in the highest offices of the U.S. government; from pre-school teachers in the slums of Mumbai to film producers in the studios of Hollywood; from youth workers ministering to gangs in Mexico City to factory workers ministering to the working class of Beijing. God has called these individuals to grow his Kingdom and redeem his creation through the power of the gospel. Each is unique, yet each is united together as one by faith in Jesus Christ. Thus, all of our grant or scholarship recipients must have the support and accountability of their local church community.

The same is true of the Board and staff of the Foundation. We represent a huge diversity of backgrounds: geographical, cultural, economic, political, and denominational. Yet we are joined together in community. Not just as family by birth and marriage, but as brothers and sisters in Christ, members of his body seeking together to fulfill the great commandment and commission by investing in the mustard seeds of God's Kingdom being sown, watered and grown throughout the nations.
