### 2012 Overview

When we started the Mustard Seed Foundation thirty years ago in 1983, we knew it would be an eventful family adventure. In the early years, our Lord gave us a few thousand dollars each year to distribute to those ministries and students in need. Gradually, the amounts increased to millions of dollars of grants and scholarships each year for the Lord's work around the world.

Over the past few years, the amount of funds Mustard Seed has to distribute has decreased substantially, but we continue to gather as a family to grant funds for the Harvey Fellows Program, Theology of Work grants, and support for church ministries and missions worldwide.

In 2012, 315 grants were awarded to church projects, most of them outside of the United States, totalling \$1.3 million. This work of encouraging and building up local churches around the world remains a major emphasis of the Foundation. We also gave 45 grants totaling \$261,963 to fund courses worldwide on the Theology of Work (TOW). Over 5000 students completed the TOW courses, making it a very fruitful program of the Mustard Seed Foundation. In addition, we provided \$121,375 for scholarship funds for students enrolled at Bakke Graduate University in Seattle. Most of the BGU courses are now taught online and continue to educate hundreds of students in locations around the world. MSF also provided \$634,334 to fund 72 Christian graduate students through our Harvey Fellows Program, in addition to hosting a biannual Summer Institute on Faith and Vocation for 36 Fellows in Washington DC.

The most difficult action taken this year was saying goodbye to our international staff members. Facing greater limitations in our funding going forward, we had to reduce our staffing levels substantially and consolidate our administration in a single office. Amy Chan, Milan Sefcik, Suresh Thomas, Victor Omondi, Vivian Fayek and Art Sibal each were important members of the Mustard Seed family. We are profoundly grateful for their faithful service to Christ and for their many contributions to the Foundation's effectiveness worldwide. On the Mustard Seed Foundation Board of Directors, 2012 marked the end of a five-year term for Carolyn March. She did a remarkable job remaining engaged throughout her term, most of which was spent while ministering with her husband in London. We welcome Tuck Laffitte to a second term on the board. As in the past, we look forward to benefiting from Tuck's perspective and wisdom in the coming years. We continue the long tradition of a having a Mustard Seed Foundation Junior Board made up of younger family members. Led by Co-Chairs Luke Harvey and William Thompson, the junior board meets several times a year to award grants to projects they believe are worthy. We want to welcome Emma Bakke, who is serving as Chair of the Junior Board for 2012-13.

When we started the Mustard Seed Foundation, we didn't have a detailed plan as to how the Foundation would progress or how long we would continue. For thirty years our chief aim has been prayerfully to steward the funds God provides in ways that honor Him and support the work of His church worldwide. We still don't have a definitive plan as to when MSF will give its last grant. Until that day comes, our plan is to continue to steward the resources we have been entrusted to foster kingdom work around the world. This work continues to be a joy and privilege for our families and for our staff.

#### Grants Overview

In 2012 we awarded \$1,349,022 in grants matched by local churches to help establish 315 new innovative, grass-roots ministries in the largest urban centers of the world.

As our name implies, the Mustard Seed Foundation provides seed funding for small startup projects of churches and Christian organizations around the world. We seek to partner with local congregations that identify, equip, and support their members who are called to specific areas of ministry in the Church and society. We look for initiatives that offer innovative approaches to church-based ministries.

Mustard Seed seeks to help launch projects through its grants as a minority partner, providing funds over a limited time period, and in a way that encourages self-sufficiency and reliance on indigenous church support. We consider local church accountability and financial support to be primary indicators of the priority and integrity of a particular project and key to its long-term sustainability. All of the funds given as grants are matched by funds from local churches connected to the projects.

The Foundation recognizes the unique challenges and opportunities faced by urban churches. As the world rapidly urbanizes, we believe that investing in churches located in large cities to be particularly strategic. The Foundation awards most grants in the largest urban centers of the world.

Mustard Seed awards grants to a wide variety of projects. We typically fund initiatives that share the gospel with non-Christians (outreach), generate income and economic decisionmaking opportunities to poorer Christians (empowerment), or equip Christians to better proclaim and demonstrate the gospel (discipleship).

### T.A. Bakke Award

Each year the Mustard Seed Foundation designates one grant award as a special tribute to the life of one of our founding board members. Tollef A. Bakke was a second generation Norwegian immigrant who lived and worked in the Pacific Northwest and Colorado. He also participated in a trip to the Holy Land that profoundly influenced his faith.

We recognize the grant award to Good Shepherd Arabic Evangelical Alliance Church in El-Sowaidaa, Syria as our 2012 Tollef A. Bakke Award. This was a two-year \$6,000 grant matching church support to establish a language center for outreach in a small town in southern Syria.

#### Savina Tong Award

Savina Tong represented the Foundation for eight years to encourage the work of local churches in East Asia. Savina helped the Foundation to connect with the fast-growing church of mainland China as well as in the more open locations of Hong Kong and Taiwan. Since her passing in 2010, the Foundation has selected a grant award each year as a tribute to her life and ministry among us.

We recognize the grant award to Christian Mission Center of Grace in Hong Kong as our 2012 Savina Tong Award. This award was the final portion of a \$23,000 grant matching church support to establish a Chinese (Guangdong) Opera outreach among youth in the Yuen Long community.

### Harvey Fellows Program

In 2012 the Foundation invested \$634,334 in support of 72 graduate students preparing to enter strategic ministry in academia, the arts, and the marketplace. We were privileged to award 10 new fellowships to an extraordinary group of graduate students from around the world. The Foundation hosted a Summer Institute in June of 2012 in Washington, D.C. to bring Fellows together for a dialogue on the integration of faith and vocation.

The Mustard Seed Foundation initiated the Harvey Fellows Program in 1992 to mark, equip, and encourage followers of Jesus Christ who seek to actively integrate their faith and vocations as leaders in strategic occupations where Christians appear to be underrepresented. This idea grew from our understanding of God as Creator and Redeemer, not only of human beings, but also of society's disciplines and structures. Our desire is to identify, prepare, and celebrate this generation's Josephs, Lydias, Daniels, and Esthers—Christians who will assume positions of leadership and influence in society. The Harvey Fellowship is a stipend of \$12,000 that may be renewed for up to two additional years. The award is given to outstanding students enrolled at a premier graduate degree program and is therefore very competitive. Harvey Fellows typically attend schools considered by professionals to be among the top five globally in a given subject area or specialty.

# BGU Scholarships

In 2012 we were pleased to award scholarships through the Bakke Graduate University (BGU) for the advanced studies of 39 ministry practitioners totaling \$121,375. These talented men and women come from, and serve in, a variety of urban centers around the world where they are actively responding to God's calling in ministry.

This was our final year of this program. Our BGU Scholarship initiative was an evolution and expansion of a previous scholarship initiative – the RJB Urban Ministry Award. Beginning in 1995, the Foundation provided scholarship funds to doctoral students studying under Dr. Raymond J. Bakke at Eastern Baptist Seminary. The RJB Award was suspended briefly from 2001 to 2002 until Ray began teaching again at Northwest Graduate School. In 2005, the school was renamed Bakke Graduate University (BGU). Beginning in 2006, the initiative was expanded to support an increasing number of students in scholarships named after Ray and his three younger siblings – Mrs. Marilyn Bakke Pearson, Mr. Dennis Bakke, and Dr. Lowell Bakke – who have contributed significantly to the ministry of the Mustard Seed Foundation and formation of Bakke Graduate University.

Since the Mustard Seed Foundation began providing scholarships to students at BGU in 2006, we have invested over \$1.25 million in scholarship support. These scholarships focused on encouraging ministry practitioners to obtain advanced degrees to deepen the theological basis of their work and ministry. Most of those supported are pursuing the Doctorate of Ministry (DMin) degree in Transformational Leadership for the Global City that is offered through BGU on a non-residential, modular basis. The Foundation also supported a handful of students pursuing a Master of Arts in Social and Civic Entrepreneurship (MASCE), a Master of Arts in Global Urban Leadership (MAGUL), Master of Business Administration (MBA), or Doctor of Transformational Leadership (DTL). After supporting hundreds of ministry practitioners to continue their education, the Foundation has discontinued this program to prioritize our limited funding into other giving areas.

## Theology of Work

In 2012 we awarded 45 Theology of Work (TOW) grants totaling \$261,963 to seminaries and ministries worldwide. Over 5,000 students participated in courses in hopes that through them churches will actively teach their congregants a strong theology of work that brings the same sense of calling to one's work in the world as one's work within the Church.

The Theology of Work grant program was established in 2007 by the Mustard Seed Foundation in collaboration with Bakke Graduate University (BGU). The aim of this special grant initiative is to enable theological institutions and training organizations worldwide to instruct seminarians, pastors, and educators in a biblical basis of a theology of work. It is our desire to see those trained through our grants begin teaching and modeling this theological concept in their own churches and ministries. This theological understanding empowers lay people to infuse their Christian faith in the institutions, structures, and industries in which they work throughout the week.

TOW grants are awarded to theological institutions, both formal and non-formal, to create and offer courses that teach students a theology of work. The institutions are encouraged to integrate this theology into their core curriculum to continue to teach the course after the grant-funded classes are completed. The TOW grant program is administered by BGU, which fosters a network of people and resources specializing in developing and teaching curriculum for theology of work.



## Financials

The Foundation's expenditures totaled nearly \$3.25 million in 2012. Over 72 percent of these funds were given through 384 grants to churches and Christian organizations, and over 100 scholarships to individuals. The remaining 27 percent was used to administer this work.

Providing grants for small startup projects of churches in major urban centers worldwide remains the primary giving area of the Foundation, as it has been since the Foundation's inception. The remainder of the Foundation's giving was channeled through the Harvey Fellows Program, BGU Scholarships, and the Theology of Work grant program. The Foundation actively assesses our giving areas and administrative framework in conjunction with our anticipated financial resources. In 2012, the Foundation made the difficult decision to close our international offices and consolidate administrative functions in our Falls Church office around a significantly smaller staff team. This decision, while difficult, will better contain the amount of funds spent on administering our work while maximizing our giving through grants and scholarships.
