The Foundation was created as an expression of their desire to be faithful stewards of the financial resources entrusted to them, to bring together the Christian members of their extended families into common ministry, and to advance the kingdom of God. The Foundation provides grants to churches and Christian organizations worldwide that are engaged in ministries including outreach, discipleship, and economic empowerment. The Foundation also awards scholarships to Christians pursuing advanced educational degrees in preparation for leadership roles in both the Church and society. All directors and staff of the Mustard Seed Foundation are committed followers of Jesus Christ and affirm the Lausanne Covenant.

Dear Friends and Family,

What a joy it is to celebrate another year of giving through the Mustard Seed Foundation—our twenty-third year of operation! The Foundation's primary approach to our giving is to discern what God is doing through churches worldwide, and provide those churches whose grant applications we approve with matching funds to enable them to carry out the work to which they are committed. Because our grants are generally local, small, and designed to support projects that have local church funding and accountability, we truly see "mustard seeds" of God's kingdom grow and flourish through our grantees.

Our outstanding staff team is credited with our capacity to reach and respond to local church congregations around the world to assist them in launching grassroots ministry efforts to disciple and empower their own and proclaim and demonstrate the gospel in their communities. Total giving by the Foundation in 2006 was over \$6.6 million, about \$900,000 more than we awarded in 2005. We awarded 830 grants averaging approximately \$5,300 per

grant, by far our greatest number of grants awarded in a single year in our history! Over 65% of our grants and scholarships in 2006 were awarded to churches and schools outside the United States. Theological Education scholarships totaling over \$1.3 million were awarded to 1,113 students attending 64 seminaries and Bible colleges, all outside North America. This is another record number of theological scholarships awarded in a single year.

Through the Harvey Fellows Program, the Foundation awarded nearly \$1 million to 66 academically gifted Christian graduate students who are called to be ambassadors

for Christ in secular vocations. We are committed to grow this strategic and highly competitive program. In order to keep the fellowship selective, we plan to award grants to no more than 10% of the applicants who apply for the Harvey Fellowship.

The Bakke Graduate University (BGU), an international Christian graduate program with a home office in Seattle, is rapidly becoming a priority for the Foundation. In 2006, MSF provided \$100,000 in financial aid to 26 students from around the world pursuing advanced theological degrees through BGU. These scholarships were given in the name of Ray Bakke, Marilyn Bakke Pearson, and Lowell Bakke. We hope to increase our scholarship assistance to BGU to \$500,000 annually in the next five years.

Reducing the percentage of money spent on administration has been an emphasis for us during the last four years. Even with the 12.5% increase in grant and scholarship monies awarded in 2006, the cost of administering the Foundation increased only 5.5%. The result was that the Foundation spent 15.8% of our annual operating funds on administration, very near our long-term goal of 15%. We are proud of the continued discipline and efficiency shown by our staff in this area of the Foundation.

Duane Grobman will be leaving his current role as Executive Director with the Foundation to return to his home in Southern California. Duane will continue to give leadership to our Harvey Fellows Program, a role he has done admirably for the last five years. The Foundation staff and Board have greatly appreciated Duane's wise, empowering leadership during these past three years. We are pleased that Eric Hornberger and Lonni Jackson, two of our long-standing regional leaders, will assume leadership of the Foundation in March 2007.

We welcomed a number of new staff members, namely Maged Shafik in Cairo, Suresh Thomas in Mumbai, Hilton Figueiredo in Sao Paulo, and both Eric Musee and Victor Omondi in Nairobi. This brings the total number of staff to 16 who represent the Mustard Seed Foundation in awarding grants and scholarships globally. We also say goodbye and thank you to Abraham Thomas from Mumbai, who retired at the close of the year after ably representing the Foundation in India for five years and serving

with distinction as the first non-American member of our staff team.

The Foundation benefits immeasurably from the hard work, prayer, and wise counsel of our Board of Directors, who represent three generations of the extended Bakke and Harvey families. In 2006 Andrea Bakke concluded her five-year term on the Board, and her husband Woody Bakke was selected to serve as a new Board member. We continue to enjoy connecting the Board with individual grantees from around the world that share the same faith.

The MSF Junior Board, comprised of family members who are 13-18 years old,

stepped up their giving in 2006, awarding 18 grants totaling \$269,055. This year the Junior Board focused their giving on one region of the world during each grant review session, enabling them to learn more about the global Church and its witness in differing parts of the world. We thank Daniel Thompson, who chaired the Junior Board in 2005-06, and welcome the leadership of Nathan Mansell as our current Junior Board Chairman.

Each year as we prepare this Annual Report, both to celebrate our grantees and to chronicle the Foundation's activities, we are reminded that our Lord graciously provides all good things out of His perfect love for His children. We are blessed by Christ's gifts of faith, relationships, vision, healing, and life. It is our hope that we will continue to connect with gifted individuals to plant seeds of hope. God is at work in amazing ways through His faithful, obedient Church, and we count it a privilege to partner in small ways with Christians around the globe.

GUIDING PRINCIPLES

CHRIST AND HIS KINGDOM

The gospel of Jesus Christ and the advancement of His kingdom are central to all that we are and all that we do. It is our joy to worship and serve Him and to submit ourselves to the authority of the Bible. We seek to be Christ's servants and ambassadors and to encourage as many as will come to follow Christ. We seek to encourage the formation of disciples from every "unreached" community, city, and culture. We desire to see the whole Church bring the whole gospel to the whole world. Therefore, we award grants and scholarships to churches and individuals representing the spectrum of Biblical Christianity, including Orthodox, Catholic, Protestant, and Evangelical traditions. We affirm God's redeeming and restorative grace and power as sufficient to bring blessing to all structures, institutions, and societies. All grant and scholarship recipients of the Mustard Seed Foundation must proclaim a personal faith in Christ, affirm the basic tenets of orthodox Christianity, and desire to serve and witness in Christ's name.

LOCAL CHURCH

We recognize the Church as God's primary representative in the world. Therefore, we try to maximize the role and responsibility of local congregations in the initiatives we support. We seek to partner with and empower local congregations to identify, equip, and support their members who are called to specific areas of ministry in the church, the marketplace, and in the world. We also consider local church financial support and accountability as primary indicators of the significance and integrity of any potential grant initiative.

INDIVIDUALS IN COMMUNITY

We believe that God endows individuals with the passions and gifts needed to further the work of His kingdom. We believe that God desires those whom He calls and equips to be both nurtured by and held accountable to the local Body of Christ. Thus, in all our giving we seek to support individuals who are active members of a church community. It is our belief that individuals are strongest and most able to fulfill their callings when they are integral members of a local church. The power of individuals to be agents of grace and change in community is exemplified in history. We therefore seek opportunities to empower individuals who are clearly affirmed and supported by their local church, to use their unique gifts to fulfill their callings.

GLOBAL

The Mustard Seed Foundation recognizes the global nature of the Body of Christ. Therefore, we desire to participate in God's work to encourage churches and individuals through grants and scholarships around the world. Our goal is to give the majority of our annual funding to individuals and churches worldwide, while intentionally limiting our giving in the United States. Since the Foundation's inception in 1983, we have awarded grants and scholarships in nearly 150 countries.

SMALL BEGINNINGS

The Biblical parable of the mustard seed reminds us that great things often have small beginnings. Through abiding in Christ and following Him our seemingly small efforts possess power beyond imagination. This parable exhorts us to respond faithfully to God's calling and to trust outcomes to Him. In our giving we seek to trust individuals and churches as they listen to God by taking small steps toward their visions. Therefore, our grants are available to local churches, including the poor, powerless, and the unproven. We recognize that results cannot be guaranteed and that big results often have risky beginnings. We choose to specialize in small, start-up initiatives, trusting local churches and individuals who possess great vision for their communities and for the future.

GIVING AREAS

GRANTS

As our name implies, the Mustard Seed Foundation provides seed funding for small start-up projects of churches and Christian organizations around the world. We seek to partner with local congregations that identify, equip, and support their members who are called to specific areas of ministry in the Church and society. We look for initiatives that offer innovative approaches to local church-based ministries. The Foundation seeks to help launch projects as a minority partner, providing funds over a limited time period, and in a way that encourages self-sufficiency and reliance on the local church. We consider local church accountability and financial support to be primary indicators of the priority, integrity, and sustainability of a particular project. A church must be willing to invest financially in a project for us to consider funding that project. The Foundation has a strong interest in the unique challenges faced by the urban church. As the world rapidly urbanizes, we believe that investing in churches located in large cities to be particularly strategic. We typically fund projects that share the gospel with non-Christians (outreach), generate income and economic decision-making opportunities for poorer Christians (empowerment), or equip Christians to better proclaim and demonstrate the gospel (discipleship).

SCHOLARSHIPS

The Mustard Seed Foundation offers a variety of scholarship opportunities for Christians seeking advanced degrees in the United States and around the world. We believe that providing scholarships to individuals who are furthering their formal education to become better ministers within the local church and society, helps enable the Church to reach the whole world with the whole gospel. The Foundation believes that our scholarships empower individuals to take ownership for equipping themselves for Christian service. Scholarships also encourage educational institutions to remain student-focused and accountable to deliver high quality education at an affordable cost. Through our scholarship initiatives, the Mustard Seed Foundation hopes to equip believers for strategic roles within the full spectrum of Christian ministry, from place of business to place of worship. In 2006, the Foundation awarded scholarships through three programs: Harvey Fellows, Theological Education, and Bakke Graduate University Scholarships.


2006 OVERVIEW

The Foundation's expenditures totaled nearly \$8 million in 2006, which is roughly 15 percent more than 2005. About 84 percent of these funds went directly to individuals and churches through almost 1,800 scholarships and 830 grants. The remaining 15.8 percent, or \$1,261,889, was used to administer our work through our international team of 16 staff located in nine countries around the globe.

Nearly 53 percent, or \$4,139,968, of our total operating expenditures was given through grants to local churches primarily in major urban centers. Granting remains to be our largest giving area and continued to grow in its share of our overall expenditures in 2006. Our granting is divided into six

geographic regions. While North America continues to be our largest granting region in terms of financial investment, its share compared to the other regions continued to decrease in 2006.

Scholarship giving was channeled through our Harvey Fellows, Theological Education, and Bakke Graduate University Scholarship Programs. Together these scholarship initiatives represent 31.4 percent, or \$2,499,375, of our 2006 expenditures. While scholarships increased overall in total dollars, it slightly decreased in its share of our total giving. The remaining one percent was given to Christian organizations through matching personal gifts given by Foundation Board and staff.

GRANTS



Granting to projects around the world is our largest giving area of the Foundation, representing 51 percent of all expenditures and 62 percent of all giving in 2006. We had tremendous growth in granting, from \$3,440,971 and 673 grants in 2005, to \$4,139,968 and 830 grants in 2006. This represents an increase of about 20 percent and is our largest number of grants awarded in a single year. Approximately 87 percent of all grants were awarded directly to local church congregations involved in grassroots ministry within their own communities.

There was growth in the total number of grants awarded in all regions. The most significant growth was seen in Europe where the number of grants awarded doubled. Asia continues to be our largest granting region, receiving nearly 40 percent of all grants awarded by the Foundation. Latin America and the Middle East, historically smaller granting regions for the Foundation, continued to have the smallest amount of growth. In order to strengthen the granting in these regions, we increased our staff presence in both regions to become more globally balanced in our granting.

The total funds awarded increased in nearly every geographic region in 2006. Africa saw an increase of 52 percent in the total funds awarded. The Foundation continued to intentionally limit growth in granting in North America in order to channel the majority of granting funds outside of the United States. In 2006 North American grants were just 28 percent of the total granting dollars awarded, the smallest share in the history of the Foundation.

Granting continued to be focused on three broad areas of ministry. We funded discipleship projects to equip Christians to better engage in ministry, empowerment initiatives that build up resources of economically disenfranchised Christians, and outreach projects that proclaim the gospel of Christ throughout the world. The vast majority of our granting, 74 percent, continued to be directed toward outreach. Projects in this category included Christian slum-based preschools, social outreaches, youth programs, and cross-cultural missions. In 2006 alone, we supported over 200 church plants in 45 countries. Empowering poor Christians came primarily in the form of the establishment of revolving loan funds in Africa. However, they also came in the form of a variety of micro-enterprise programs in both Asia and the Middle East. Discipleship programs tended to focus on inspiring and equipping individuals for increased service in local churches and in the cultivation of indigenous Christian leadership through short-term non-formal education programs.

The Foundation continues to have a strong interest in the unique challenges faced by the urban church and helping it become a more dynamic witness in the advancement of the kingdom. We believe major urban centers are particularly strategic and we seek to encourage the establishment of new ministry in the largest cities of the world. In fact, 85 percent of all grants awarded went to support grassroots ministries in urban areas. We celebrate our investments made in the cities that received the largest number of our grants in 2006, including Mumbai, Delhi, Nairobi, Manila, New York and Los Angeles.



AFRICA

The Foundation is grateful for the opportunity to partner with Sub-Saharan African churches to share the hope of Christ. We saw an increase in the number of grants by 35 percent and funds awarded by 52 percent to a total of \$630,036 through 174 grants. The average size of each project slightly increased to \$3,506. The Foundation is excited about this dramatic growth as we continue to make small investments in a large number of churches in the urban centers of Africa.

The majority of African projects were for churches to reach out in their communities, but nearly 25 percent of all grants awarded in Africa in 2006 went towards empowerment projects.

We believe it is best done when decision-making power is given directly to the individual. About 90 percent of empowerment projects in Africa were church-based revolving loan funds, where local churches give small loans to individual members, commonly within a co-op or group, to start a small business. These loans are typically paid back to the church and re-loaned to other individuals as a continuing example of Christian witness to the community. These types of grants doubled in Africa in 2006, showing the truly entrepreneurial nature of the continent.



ASIA

The Asia region extends from India in the West to the island nations of the South Pacific in the East. It is densely populated, containing several of the most populous countries in the world, and also wonderfully diverse. There are almost a dozen cities in Asia with populations over 10 million in which the very affluent and the impoverished live side-by-side. In 2006 the Foundation awarded \$1,009,149 through 317 grants largely to local churches in urban centers. The average size of a grant decreased slightly from 2005 to \$3,183, because roughly half of these grants were awarded in India's slum communities where both church budgets and projects are typically very small.

Trends in our granting vary in different parts of the continent, in large part due to the tremendous diversity of the region. In

South Asia, we funded slum-based ministries including Christian preschools, tutoring, English classes, and health education centers supported and run by the local church as a means of reaching out to the broader society. Southeast Asian churches initiated projects to help individuals generate income, to reach out to children and youth, and to send cross-cultural missionaries to minister elsewhere in the region. The Foundation supported many social outreach projects in East Asia, such as art and music lessons, drug rehabilitation, and elderly centers in 2006. We also continued to fund non-formal theological training in various church networks to equip and encourage new church leaders in mainland China and to plant churches in the country's largest cities



EUROPE

Europe's churches face a number of challenges but also have many opportunities to reach out to the broader society. In the West, churches struggle to relate to a post-Christian culture, yet many youth appear to be open to the gospel. In the East, post-communist culture has brought religious freedoms, and yet a cynicism about organized religion remains. Central Asian churches are finding it increasingly difficult to function in Islamic societies. Yet the Church continues to grow in this region and strives to be Christ's transforming presence. In 2006 we significantly increased our support to the European Church by increasing the total dollar amount by 50 percent and doubling the number of projects to

\$908,830 and 107 grants. The average size of a grant slightly increased to \$8,494.

Much of our granting in Europe was awarded to projects focusing on the next generation and on new immigrants. A large portion of the grants awarded went to projects for children, teens or young adults through summer camps, education programs, or non-traditional church services in unusual places. Projects reaching out to immigrants from Asia and Africa, as well as gypsy communities, continue to be an important part of our granting in Europe as the number of immigrants increase.

LATIN AMERICA

Latin America includes all of Central and South America as well as the Caribbean. Granting to this primarily nominally Catholic culture is of interest to the Foundation as we continue to invest in the largest urban centers of the world, many of which are within the Latin America region. The total number of projects supported increased to 33 in 2006 while the total dollar amount slightly decreased. This decrease is due to the dramatic drop in average grant size from \$7,153 to \$5,826 that reflects the grassroots nature of our granting to local, indigenous churches.

MIDDLE EAST

Christians are a small portion of the overall population of the Middle East, a region stretching from Mauritania to Turkey to Pakistan. Nevertheless we believe encouraging this Church is important because the region is strategic in our global economy, the birthplace of our faith, and more importantly, an integral part of the Body of Christ. We celebrate the 50 grants awarded primarily to local churches in 2006 in this region totaling \$243,350. These projects spanned 12 countries with an average grant size of \$4,863, a small decrease from 2005. Over 50 percent of the

projects continued to be in Egypt where over half of all Christians in the region reside.

The projects supported by the Foundation in the Middle East were very diverse in nature but many had a similar goal: to actively demonstrate the gospel to the broader society. These projects varied considerably, including community preschools, health clinics, nonformal Christian education, and short-term missions, as well as income generating projects for poor Christians.

NORTH AMERICA

The Foundation continued to support innovative and transformative ministry efforts in the United States and Canada, our North America region, in 2006. Although capital is easier to access in North America, some churches are just not able to start the new projects they envision. The Foundation came alongside these churches to help support 149 projects in 2006 with a total investment of \$1,156,353. The average size of each grant decreased slightly from 2005 to \$7,760. This low grant size in a relatively expensive region is a testament to the grassroots nature of the projects in North America and the small churches with whom we usually partner.

Almost 40 percent of the grants awarded went to immigrant congregations or churches reaching out to immigrant communities that are characteristic of large cities. We are pleased to have awarded over 80 grants in the largest cities in the U.S.—New York City, Los Angeles, and Chicago.



TOLLEF A. BAKKE MEMORIAL AWARD

Each year, the Mustard Seed Foundation designates one grant award as a special tribute to the life of one of our founding board members. Tollef A. Bakke was a second generation Norwegian immigrant who lived and worked in the Pacific Northwest and Colorado. He also participated in a trip to the Holy Land that profoundly influenced his faith. We highlight one project from these regions in honor of him.

We recognize the grant award to Wiconi International in Vancouver, Washington as our 2006 Tollef A. Bakke Memorial Award. The award in 2006 was the first of a three-year grant totaling \$15,000 to match local church investments to support Christian Pow Wows among Native Americans in the Pacific Northwest.

HARVEY FELLOWS

The Foundation initiated the Harvey Fellows Program in 1992. Its aim is to mark, equip, and encourage followers of Jesus Christ to actively integrate their faith and vocations as leaders in strategic occupations where Christians tend to be underrepresented. The idea grew from our understanding of God as Creator and Redeemer, not only of human beings, but also of society's disciplines and structures. Through the program the Foundation seeks to identify, prepare, and celebrate this generation's Josephs, Lydias, Daniels, and Esthers - Christians who will assume positions of leadership and influence in fields such as media, government, scientific research, and higher education. Each Harvey Fellow is awarded a \$15,000 annual stipend renewable up to a total of three years. The award is portable to a premier graduate degree program, subject to approval by the selection committee. Generally, only schools considered to be among the top five by professionals in a given area of specialty are acceptable destinations.

A significant component of the program is participation in our Summer Institute that provides a forum for Fellows to be challenged on issues of integrating faith and vocation, as well as a setting to deepen relationships among Fellows. The weeklong 2006 Summer Institute was held in June in Alexandria, Virginia. It is the Foundation's hope that all who attend the Institute gain a clearer vision to proclaim the truth to the world where God has called them. Thus we strive to offer the musician, historian, artist, policy analyst, business leader, and professor a broader sense of calling and for Fellows to help one another on their respective journeys.

Our relationship with Fellows continues past graduation, as senior Fellows play a key role in the selection of new Fellows each year and provide guidance on our Advisory Board. The support, mentoring, and friendships that have flourished among the network of Harvey Fellows is an important aspect of the program. The Harvey Fellows Program is poised to be a cornerstone of the Mustard Seed Foundation for many years to come.

In 2006 the Foundation invested \$941,000 in support of 66 graduate students preparing to enter strategic ministry in academia, the arts, and the marketplace. We were privileged to award 32 new fellowships to an extraordinary group of graduate students representing a variety of nationalities and preparing for vocations in diverse fields.

THEOLOGICAL EDUCATION



The Mustard Seed Foundation launched the Theological Education scholarship program in 1999 to support students pursuing advanced theological training outside of North America. Since its inception we have awarded over \$5 million to help fund the formal theological education of thousands of students around the world. Scholarships are awarded for up to half of the total cost of education. Qualifying students must be attending a participating institution and receiving a significant level of financial support from their home church or Christian organization. Recipients must be pursuing degrees that equip them for service to the Church in the areas of preaching, teaching, missions or evangelism. However, priority is given to those who are being trained to directly minister in a church congregation or preparing for ministry within an urban context. The scholarships are administered in direct collaboration with the participating institutions.

In 2006 we invested a total of \$1,388,609 through 64 institutions in Africa, Asia, Europe, Latin America and the Middle East. We are pleased to have awarded scholarships to 1,113 students, the greatest number of individuals we have ever supported in a single year. Our total support for this initiative slightly increased from 2005 due to the addition of newly participating institutions in all geographic regions, as well as increases in scholarship support at many institutions that have been participating for a number of years.

As an extension of our Theological Education scholarship program, we continued to provide support for students pursuing certificate level training by extension at the College of Christian Theology in Bangladesh. In 2006 we provided a total of \$5,000 for 622 scholarships at this interdenominational seminary serving the Church in Bangladesh.

BGU SCHOLARSHIPS

In 1996 the Foundation began offering a handful of scholarships to outstanding urban ministry practitioners from around the world. These individuals pursued non-residential doctoral studies under the mentorship of Dr. Ray Bakke, global urban missiologist and founding member of Mustard Seed Foundation's Board of Directors. Since its inception the scholarship program has gone through a number of changes, and in 2005 we began awarding the scholarship to students at the Bakke Graduate School (BGU). The mission and values of BGU are similar to those of the Foundation and complement our vision to support dynamic Christian leaders around the world.

In 2006 we broadened our scholarship support to BGU to not only honor the life and ministry of Dr. Ray Bakke, but also those of his younger siblings, Rev. Lowell Bakke and Mrs. Marilyn Bakke Pearson. With these scholarships the Foundation has chosen to highlight three of our current and former Board members who have significantly contributed to the life of the Mustard Seed Foundation as well as the Kingdom of God through their own unique areas of gifting.


The Mustard Seed Foundation's scholarship support in 2006 was primarily for students pursuing the Transformational Leadership for the Global City Doctor of Ministry (DMin) degree at BGU. This program is designed to enhance the leadership skills of individuals currently engaged in Christian ministry.

The Foundation also supported students who are pursuing the Master of Theological Studies (MTS) degree. The MTS degree explores global and urban perspectives to the application of theology and allows each student to specialize in an area of ministry for their unique context.

We were pleased to award scholarships at Bakke Graduate University for the advanced degree studies of 26 ministry practitioners totaling \$100,000, doubling our investment in 2006. These talented men and women come from and serve in a variety of places around the world where they are actively responding to God's calling to ministry.




